


We will celebrate all mothers, ages from 1 - 101 May 12th.

Sign-up sheets will be available around the first of June. Please consider where you might help to make the social a success.


Rowes Corners Cemetery Association


Book of the Month





JUNIOR CHURCH

Junior Church has begun the study of the gospel of John that will likely take us nearly a year to complete. The memory verse from our introduction lesson says it all. "But these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name." John 20:31

Each month in The Corner Church Beacon, we will share our summary of the things the kids will be learning that month. We do not meet the first Sunday of the month, but do meet all the other Sundays, departing worship during the hymn that follows the reading of the Scripture and returning during the final hymn.

Here is our curriculum summary for May:





On the Road to Emmaus Luke 24: 13 - 16

13 Now that same day two of them were going to a village called Emmaus, about seven miles[a] from Jerusalem. 14 They were talking with each other about everything that had happened. 15 As they talked and discussed these things with each other, Jesus himself came up and walked along with them; 16 but they were kept from recognizing him.

Do you know what an Emmaus Walk is? The Walk to Emmaus seeks to inspire, challenge, and equip leaders for Christian action in their homes, places of work and communities.

Pastor Tom Waller, Gordon McCalla, Herb Hewett, and Elizabeth Hewett attended the Southeast Michigan Emmaus Walk. The following are comments from Gordon, Herb and Elizabeth.

Gordon: "About the recent Emmaus Walk, I can sum it up like this; Emotional, so many hugs, and crying, spiritual, praising the Lord, fun, laughter, bad jokes, etc., singing to the Lord."

Herb: "My walk has been a very rewarding experience. I have learned so much about myself and what I need to do to grow in Christ. If you have never been on an Emmaus Walk, I highly recommend it.

In Luke 24: 13 – 16 we read the story of the two disciples walking to Emmaus. We see Jesus seeking them, approaching them, and how He opened their eyes to understanding the fulfillment of the scriptures through his death and resurrection. I honestly thought this event would be the main topic, (what little I knew). But what I saw, what I felt, what I experienced, what I witnessed, and what I can testify to is a community of Christian love, demonstrating the hands and feet of Jesus. In Matthew 25:36-40. 36 I was naked and you clothed Me; I was sick and you visited Me; I was in prison and you came to Me.' 37 "Then the righteous will answer Him, saying, 'Lord, when did we see You hungry and feed You, or thirsty and give You drink? 38 When did we see You a stranger and take You in, or naked and clothe You? 39 Or when did we see You sick, or in prison, and come to You?' 40 And the King will answer and say to them, 'Assuredly, I say to you, inasmuch as you did it to one of the least of these My brethren, you did it to Me.'

This is My Reflection on My Walk to Emmaus and the outpouring love of men, and women in the Christian Community. I am Elizabeth Hewett, Emmaus Walk 195 Southeast Michigan, Joyful Sisters in Christ.

I was anxious, unsure, and a bit apprehensive,

Yet you welcomed me.

I was asked to be silent.

And though I will never take a vow of silence, you gave me time to reflect, meditate and wonder why I was there. I was hungry,

You fed me - perhaps, too well.

I was ill,

You comforted me by caring for me, checking on me, providing a warm blanket and the four Motrin I desperately needed.

I was lonely,

You gave me Candlelight Procession, showing support through friends, family, and community.

I was hurting and in pain,

You came and sat with me, asking no questions, willing to only be present.

I didn't realize my foundation of faith needed building up,

You showed me what piety is, how to immerse myself into God's word, how to put Christian love into action.

I saw obstacles,

You showed me how to tear them down.

I do not have sisters,

Now I have a community of sisters and one new brother.

I was challenged,

You taught me new concepts, felt a renewed call to action and am looking for a mission where I can use my gifts to serve a hurting world, or at least my little corner of it.

I love to sing,


You gave me new songs or praise and worship.

I needed prayer,

You told me people from around the world and close by, having been praying for me non-stop for 72 hours and other people had been praying even longer.

I have walked to Emmaus and will be returning home. The world hasn't changed because I stepped out of it for 3 days. Instead, Emmaus has been a place for me to pause, step away, so that I can return home, renewed, and refreshed. I invite you to Walk to Emmaus and meet Jesus on your journey.




